Infection Prevention Includes:



CLABSI bundles Care bundles help prevent line-related infections¹



CHG baths Bathing in chlorhexidine helps prevent colonization and CLABSI²



CVC removal Early removal helps prevent the disease³



Primary prevention Antifungal medications are often used to prevent infection in selected hosts⁴

Candida auris Prevention Strategies

C auris can spread easily in healthcare settings, so facilities should take special precautions to prevent the spread.⁵



Cleaning

- C auris can live on surfaces
- Use <u>EPA List P</u> <u>disinfectants</u>*



Screening healthcare contacts Helps identify *C auris* colonization



Isolation Precautions Appropriate use of gowns and gloves can prevent spread



Inter-facility communication Necessary when a patient is transferred



Hand hygiene Alcohol-based handsanitizer is effective against *C auris*
